Food from all nations will be very welcome, so please bring a specialty from another country if you can. The cooker in the kitchen will not be available to heat any food, so everything must be prepared in advance and brought in ready. The hall will be open from 4.45pm until 5.15pm if you would like to bring your dishes in advance.

Let's Go Fly a Kite! Sun 19th May from noon onwards. Meet on the green area above Jacobs Ladder Beach, adjacent to Peak Hill. We invite all the other churches, schools and the people of Sidmouth, family, friends and visitors to join us to celebrate the Church's birthday (Pentecost) together and share a large chocolate birthday cake and other special treats. Bring a picnic! Bring your kite! If you can't do either, just come anyway and bring yourself! Everyone is extremely welcome to join us. If walking is difficult, you can be dropped off by the gate half-way up Peak Hill, which will be opened for our event and that is where we all meet. See poster in the porch for further details. Laudato Si' week – calling all crafters! During Laudato Si' week (19th-26th May), there will be an exhibition and prayer walk at Plymouth Cathedral interpreting Laudato Si' through artwork and reflections by pupils from local schools. All visitors to the Cathedral will also be invited to add to a mass participation artwork called the Mossy Carpet. People are invited to make a textile tuft such as crochet, knit, embroider, plait, pompom or something else to attach to the carpet! This artwork will help us to consider how our small actions can make a huge change, and how our Christian faith calls us to be part of the restoration of nature. There will be drop-in workshops 12-4pm on 20th May at the Cathedral but the Mossy Carpet will be in place from 18th- 24th May for people to visit and add their contributions.
