General Election 2024

The Prime Minister has called a general election for Thursday 4th July. There is a range of information and guidance on key issues of importance to us, as Catholics, to help inform how we vote. Gospel values inform how we look at the world as Christians. These values can also offer a different way of looking at politics, a way that puts the common good before self-interest. Don Carson's '**A Call to Spiritual Reformation**' is available from the Mustard Seed. Focusing on the prayers of the apostle Paul, although written almost 2000 years ago, 2000 miles from here, Paul's prayers are a timely reminder that our nation needs a spiritual reformation, and that we should pray for good government as we approach the general election. 'First of all I urge, that petitions, prayers, intercession, and thanksgiving be made for all people – for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness' (1Tim2:1-2)

We all have the opportunity to make a positive difference: from the power of prayer, to the warmth of a welcome, to practical support, to donations, to supporting campaigns, to short-term hosting, together we can improve the lives of people forced to flee danger.
